

2014 Summer Research

Six scholars completed Truman's McNair Research Internship I from May 12 - 30. They attended seminars on research design and professional writing, as well as a seminar on advanced library research at Washington University's Olin Library in St. Louis, where they also met with graduate school admissions personnel. At the conclusion of the internship, scholars submitted and presented an original research proposal.

Eight scholars are participating in Truman's McNair Research Internship II from May 27 - August 1. They are conducting original research under the guidance of their faculty research supervisors. On July 30, they will present their findings to the campus community and will submit their manuscripts to Truman's McNair Scholarly Review for publication consideration.

Scholar Ryan Weber is participating in a Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU) program in biophysics at The University of Utah. From May 26 – August 2, he is researching the binding fractions of kinesin to microtubules. The REU provides a \$4,000 stipend, housing, and travel to and from Salt Lake



This spring, six Scholars from the 2013 McNair Research Internship II had their manuscripts published in Volume 20 of Truman State University's McNair Scholarly Review, a refereed journal. 2012-2017 McNair Program **Performance Objectives**

Objective 1: Participants served during the project year will complete appropriate research or scholarly activities during the McNair Program academic year.

Objective 2: Bachelor's degree recipients will be accepted and enrolled in a postbaccalaureate program of study by the fall term of the academic year immediately following the completion of the bachelor's degree.

Objective 3: First year graduate students will continue to be enrolled in graduate school at the beginning of the fall term of the next academic year.

Objective 4: Participants will attain a doctoral degree within 10 years of the attainment of the bachelor's degree.
